

MULLETT TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING MINUTES FOR
NOVEMBER 13, 2018 – 7:00 PM – TOPINABEE, MICHIGAN

The Mullett Township Board of Trustees met at the Mullett Township Hall in Topinabee, Michigan on November 13, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. All Board Members were present: Hobart Kirsch, Rachel Osborn, Kathy Flory, John Brown and Dennis Dombroski.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment was opened at 7:01 p.m. and was closed at 7:10 p.m.

John Brown motioned to approve the minutes of the October 2, 2018 meeting with a second by Kathy Flory, motion passed.

The Treasurer's report is as follows:

Jamie Chevalier of J & E Cottage Care spoke about the changes needed for his contract for next year. He suggested an irrigation system might be in order for the area south of the pavilion. Also was needed to anchor the buoys in Boy Scout Park with a better weight system in order to keep them standing in an upright position. All will be addressed in the Spring of 2019

On a motion to change the audit year from the even year to odd year was offered by Kathy Flory and seconded by Dennis Dombroski, (2019 to be the next audit), motion passed.

Discussion: Speed signs at each end of the Topinabee Village (Breakers to the Public Launch at Woodruff) tabled until the budget process and can be addressed at that time.

An extensive mark up of the Blight Ordinance was undertaken by the board. The revisions will be sent to the attorney along with the questions the board has regarding the recovery of costs.

John Brown motioned to enter into an agreement with the Cheboygan County Road Commission to provide road maintenance on the DNR Public Access from October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019 at a cost of \$624.71, seconded by Hobart Kirsch, motion passed.

Sherry Nelson sent an e-mail asking for a street light at the intersection of Jewell Road and Patrick Drive. Since her road is a private drive, the township would not be able to provide same.

Motion by Hobart Kirsch to pay the bills, seconded by John Brown, Motion passed.
